## Irving DFW Indian Lions Club Raises over \$200k with Annual Fundraiser

Irving DFW Indian Lions Club held its 15th Annual Charity Fundraising Banquet on May 7, 2011 at Sheraton Grand Hotel, DFW Airport. Texas Health Resources CEO Mr. Doug Hawthorne was honored as the "Citizen of the Year". Irving Mayor Herbert Gears was the honorable Guest Speaker. The Banquet was attended by a distinguished audience of almost 400 local leaders including prominent businessmen, professionals, charity project organizers and representatives of large civic organizations, volunteer groups, international Corporations etc. District Governor Dan Busdiecker, in his brief message, noted his joy to participate this well organized event that spreads the message of lionism to a different group of people every year.

The event raised more than \$200,000.00, majority of which will support the club-sponsored Primary Care Clinic in Lewisville and Plano. Monthly operating cost of these Clinics is around \$50,000.00 (\$600,000 annually). The Club acknowledges the commitment, generous contribu-

tions and support from the Lions, Lions Clubs, District 2-X1, and all well wishers. It's worth noting that these Clinics

have not received so far any financial support from the government.

These Clinics, with Board Certified Doctors and Nurse Practitioners, offer affordable quality health care for the uninsured patients without regard to their income or place of residence or legal status. Clinics are open Monday through Saturday (Plano 972-596-6005; Lewisville 972-221-6005). The patients pay a fixed fee of \$35 for com-

prehensive consultation. If required, routine blood tests are available for \$6 to \$12 each. Other services include PAP Tests (\$80 includes office visit, exam +lab), screening for Hepatitis, HIV, Cholesterol, PSA etc., as well as referrals for X-Rays, Ultrasound, CT Scan, MRI scan etc. at or near Medicare rates. All generic drugs, at heavily discounted prices, are made available through local pharmacies.

Irving DFW Indian Lions Club started the Primary Care Clinic in 2003 in Lewisville, and due to ever increasing demand for such a service another Clinic in Plano was started in 2007. Last year the Clinic served 7000 patient-visits compared to 900 in 2003. The Clinics have had over 33,000 patient-visits so far, and the total average market-value of the services provided amounts to Millions of Dollars. Every lion in this District can be proud of this mega project.

## Dallas Indian Lions Club Celebrates 26 Years of Service

The Dallas Indian Lions Club (DILC) celebrated 26 years of service to the community with a fundraiser, called the Festival of India, at the Holiday Inn, Plano on the 29th of April.

Three persons connected with the media provided the highlights of the evening. The Keynote Speaker, Jody Dean, host of the morning show at KLUV-FM and a member of the Texas

Radio Hall of Fame, whose motivational speech moved the audience. The Emcee, Shabnam Modgil of FunAsiaRadio, and a model for Indian RJs in the DFW area, who dwelt on the spirit of Lionism. And Haresh Ramani and his wife Neha, previously connected with the amateur theater in Mumbai, who electrified the audience with their flawless dancing.

I was pleased to be asked by Lion President, Mr Jyoti Bhatia, to arrange a dance number that would be a surprise item in the evening's entertainment. ### 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest

The theme of the 2011-12 Peace Poster Contest is

# Children Know Peace



The Contest provides the Lions and Clubs a chance to interact with young people in their communities, introducing the youth to international understanding, as well as giving Lions a vehicle for obtaining **positive publicity for their Clubs**.

**HOW IT WORKS:** Only Lions Club can sponsor a Contest in a local school or organized youth group like YMCA, Boys/Girls Clubs, Scouts, Churches, After-school-care Centers etc. The contest cannot be held in youth groups that a Lions Club sponsors, such as Leo Club or Scout unit. However individual members of such group (Leos/Scouts) may participate if the Contest is held at their school or other organized youth group. **The Contest is open to students 11, 12 or 13 years of age on November 15, 2011.** Contact local school Principals (Junior High / Middle schools), Art Teachers, Youth Groups etc. soliciting students for the contest.

**PROMOTING ARTS:** Students create posters visually depicting the contest theme "**Children Know Peace**". They use a variety of media including chalk, charcoal, crayon, pencil and paint to express the theme to spark their imagination. (Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing). The works created are unique and the contest encourages young people worldwide to artistically express their vision of peace. Artwork must be no smaller than 13"x20" and no larger than 20"x24". DO NOT laminate, mat or frame the artwork. Three-dimensional entries **not accepted**. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.

All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted. Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.

**ORDER KITS NOW:** Available until **October 1, 2011**. Clubs must purchase Contest Kit (PPK-1) either:

Each Kit (cost: \$9.95+shipping/taxes) has everything a club needs to sponsor one contest. Clubs can order more kits to sponsor more than one contest and submit to District-level judging one poster per each contest. **Order Kits early giving sufficient time (2-3 weeks for delivery) for a well planned Contest.**

**JUDGING:** Each Poster is judged on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme. One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the District Governor for judging. The posters are narrowed down at the Club, District, and Multiple District levels before the final posters are judged at the International level. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the State-level competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International HQ for the final judging. During the final judging, 23 Merit Award Winners and one Grand Prize Winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

**AWARDS:** **International Grand Prize Winner** receives a trip (along with two family members and the sponsoring Lions Club President) to the award ceremony in March 2012 at Lions Day with the United Nations and a **Cash Award of \$5,000** and an engraved plaque.

**23 Merit Award Winners** each receive cash award of **\$500** and a Certificate of Achievement.

**DEADLINES:** Check LCI website for latest updates. LCI may cancel the contest without notice. Entries not meeting the deadlines will be disqualified.
