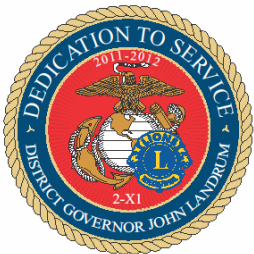

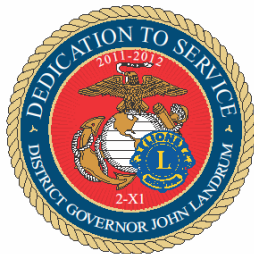

Lion Janie Covington does. In August 2011, she drove her mother to an ophthalmologist in Denison, TX (about 95 miles north of Dallas). When the exam was over, she began to question the doctor about some of his equipment, stating that the low vision clinic in Dallas was still using an "old paper eye chart" and that their Lions Club, DalCliff Wynnewood, was wanting to purchase a projector and screen for Dr. Fleming to use. As the conversation ensued, Dr. Larry Wood offered to give projector equipment to the clinic for their work as both agreed that the Lions could always find another worthy project. He had purchased one with new bells and whistles, but had in storage some "good equipment".

Lion Janie put the two doctors in touch, and then on September 21, 2011, she and her husband, Lion Tom, drove to Denison and picked up the donated projector and screen for delivery to Dr. Fleming at the low vision clinic in Dallas. Dr. Fleming said this delivery was just in time for their first clinic of the year.

Lion Janie says, "How exciting! So many people want to help, but just need to be asked." Dr. Wood's gift left dollars in our Club Treasury so we are able to help the next project - such as giving 48 pair of glasses Saturday when we sponsored the LS&TF mobile vision coach at Faith Memorial Church in Oak Cliff. This was our third year to be at this health fair in an impoverished area of our city. While the bus goes to schools regularly, this is one opportunity for the unemployed or uninsured adult to have free exams and free glasses. After all, you can't learn or work at your best if you can't see.

PEOPLE IN LORENZO NEED GLASSES TOO!

Texas is a huge land mass with thousands of cities, towns, villages, and some small specks on the map, which only show up because there is a Post Office. Most Texans have never heard of Pandale, Cornudas, Twitty, or Lawn. They have no idea how to get to Bruni, Edcouch, Vashti, or Lorenzo; and don't bother to ask for information about Danevang, Kiomatia, Iredell, or Fred. In Lionism, as in other endeavors, we tend to concentrate where there are large groups of people in need (i.e. large cities) and several Lions Clubs to share the work and costs. Many times the little ones go unnoticed.

There are hundreds of hidden little towns just like those above and as the Lions of 2-T2 recently found out, **people in Lorenzo need glasses too!** Maybe it was because the people of Lorenzo kept showing up for help at the eye screenings routinely held by the Lions Clubs in Lubbock, or maybe the Lorenzo Lions saw what a great service the Lions were offering in Lubbock.

Whatever the reason, the Lorenzo Lions held their first eye screening and clinic on 9/24 at the Lorenzo High School gym. Lions from Lubbock under the direction of 2T2's TLERC Director, PID Marshall Cooper, brought the screening lane equipment. Lion Tom Mills, an optician from Big Spring and TLERC's optical lab director, came to help fit glasses on adults. Lions from Midland Downtown brought Pedia Vision to screen the children. Dave Hoopman, TLERC's COO, brought the mobile exam room along with several thousand pair of glasses. Lion Dr. Norman Gould came to examine the children.

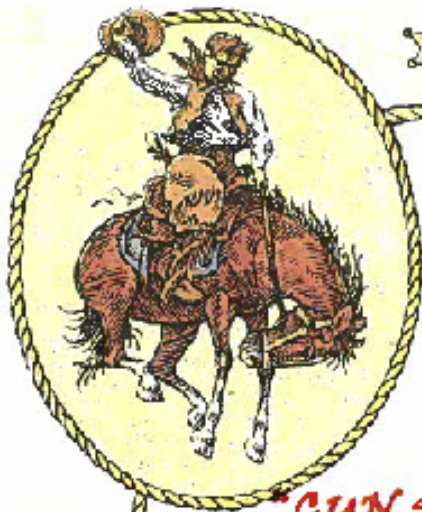
A couple of dozen adults were fitted with recycled glasses and nine children will be receiving new glasses as a result of this joint effort. It was a successful day and the Lorenzo Lions found out that being part of an International Organization means having "shovel ready" projects available. It means being part of a team (Lions from their own District, as well as 2-A1) and it means access to several Multiple District 2 State programs (in this case the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center) that they can use "to serve" their community.

It was also an important day for the Lorenzo Lions, because now they see the opportunity to partner with two other nearby small town Lions Clubs to start a regular screening for their area. They learned that if they buy just a little bit of equipment and take the TLERC training class, they can go out on their own to help eliminate preventable blindness in another small corner of Texas.

What are you doing to answer the call of Sight First: to eliminate preventable blindness around the world? Are you putting glasses on your local children for \$14/pair? Are you doing regular eye screenings in your communities? Do you have PediaVision yet? If you haven't started or if you need help with your existing programs, call your TLERC Director or call TLERC's offices. **It's just possible that the people in Twitty, Kiomatia, Pandale, Bruni, Iredell, or Fred.....need glasses too!**

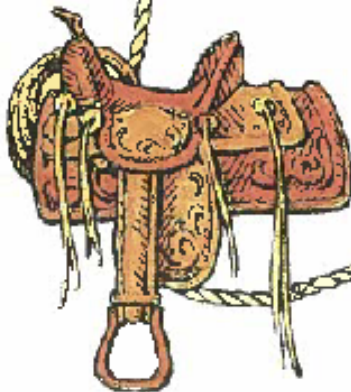

24th Annual Lions International Peace Poster
Contest



The theme of the 2011-12 Peace Poster
Contest is...

Children Know Peace

The Contest provides the Lions and Clubs a chance to interact with young people in their communities, introducing the youth to international understanding, as well as giving Lions a vehicle for obtaining **positive publicity for their Clubs**.

HOW IT WORKS: Only Lions Club can sponsor a Contest in a local school or organized youth group like YMCA, Boys/Girls Clubs, Scouts, Churches, After-school-care Centers etc. The contest cannot be held in youth groups that a Lions Club sponsors, such as Leo Club or Scout unit. However individual members of such group (Leos/Scouts) may participate if the Contest is held at their school or other organized youth group. **The Contest is open to students 11, 12 or 13 years of age on November 15, 2011.** Contact local school Principals (Junior High / Middle schools), Art Teachers, Youth Groups etc. soliciting students for the contest.

PROMOTING ARTS: Students create posters visually depicting the contest theme "**Children Know Peace**". They use a variety of media including chalk, charcoal, crayon, pencil and paint to express the theme to spark their imagination. (Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing). The works created are unique and the contest encourages young people worldwide to artistically express their vision of peace. Artwork must be no smaller than 13"x20" and no larger than 20"x24". **DO NOT** laminate, mat or frame the artwork. Three-dimensional entries **not accepted**. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.

All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted. Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.

ORDER KITS NOW: Available until **October 1, 2011**. Clubs must purchase Contest Kit (PPK-1) either:

- ◆ By mail: LCI Club Supplies Department,

Each Kit (cost: \$9.95+shipping/taxes) has everything a club needs to sponsor one contest. Clubs can order more kits to sponsor more than one contest and submit to District-level judging one poster per each contest. **Order Kits early giving sufficient time (2-3 weeks for delivery) for a well planned Contest.**

JUDGING: Each Poster is judged on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme. One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the District Governor for judging. The posters are narrowed down at the Club-level, District-level, and Multiple-District-level before the final posters are judged at the International level. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the Multiple-District-level competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International HQ for the final judging. During the final judging, **one Grand Prize Winner and 23 Merit Award Winners** are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

AWARDS are given, to Artists of Posters, at various levels as under:

- \$ 500 US Savings Bond for 2-X1 District-level winner.
- \$ 500 US Savings Bond for Multiple-Dist-level winner.
- \$5000 Cash & engraved plaque for the International Grand Prize Winner.**
- \$ 500 Cash & Certificate of Achievement to each of the **23 Merit Award Winners** at International level.

The **International Grand Prize Winner also** receives a trip (along with two family members and the sponsoring Lions Club President) to the award ceremony in March 2012 at Lions Day with the United Nations (may change).

Dallas Indian Lions Club Delivers Meals

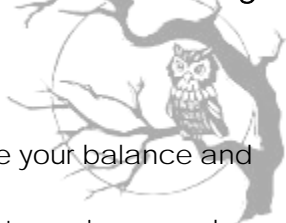

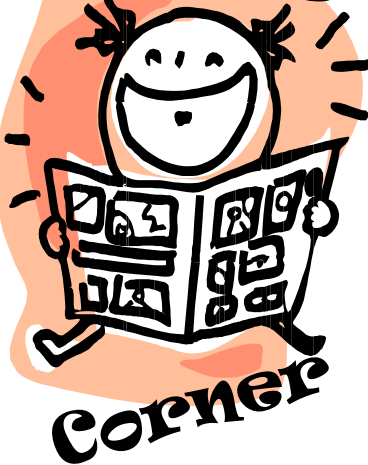


Top 10 Signs You Are Too Old to Be Trick or Treating

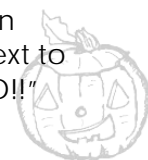
10. You get winded from knocking on the door.
